



ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY SCHOOL OF MANAGEMENT & ENTREPRENEURSHIP (USME)

The USME was established in the East Delhi campus (EDC) of DTU in the year 2017, to fulfill its mission of offering a portfolio of the highest quality of programs aimed at emerging area such as analytics and venture development, and the creation of an ecosystem for learning, research and practice in management and entrepreneurship. It aims to grow into a nodal centre for entrepreneurship, and to become a multidisciplinary practise-oriented school.

Situated in the East of Delhi, the Campus comprises three disciplines of Management, Economics and Innovation, Entrepreneurship, and Venture Development, with faculty having a background of leading institutions such as IIM Kolkata/Lucknow, IIT Madras/Ropar, JNU, DSE, etc. It houses an ecosystem that is not only multidisciplinary, but multidimensional in its range of activities. There is a network of student entrepreneurs from the MBA Entrepreneurship streams, and ventures (including the DTU-IIF incubates), mentors and professionals, in-house and visiting faculty from premier institutions and industry, and a vibrant student community.

USME not only offers degree programs at the UG, PG and doctoral levels, it has also conducted intense workshops for students such as in Entrepreneurship, Business Strategy, R for Machine Learning, the Start-up Conclave etc. which provide a lot of co-curricular learning. The cultural fest "Traction", including business contests, and many other celebrations of youthful artistic expression, including sixteen clubs in different professional and other interest areas, all lead to a rich extracurricular life on Campus. These activities have drawn students from across India, including from the IIMs and other premier colleges, and students also participate in many national level festivals and competitions.

The first USME Internship fair organised in February 2020 resulted in over three hundred fifty internship offers. This was followed by a Corporate Engagement Week organised in April 2021 which witnessed over five hundred offers to both UG and PG students.

USME has added very modern classroom infrastructure and discussion spaces, a state-of-art library and information centre, seminar rooms, and a 200-capacity state of the art Manthan Hall. The Campus students organize various events ranging from cultural fests, talks, business contests, and internship/final placement fairs, workshops and a lecture series of thought leaders across disciplines. Common Rooms, Sports and Recreation.

There is a separate common rom for girl students, and it has many facilities along with carrom and TT tables, found in all common rooms. Badminton courts are also there on Campus, along with shared international standard hockey facilities, and access to all the famed DTU Main Campus sports complex facilities for lawn tennis, cricket, gymnastics, basketball, etc. It also sends its own teams to competitions in various sports.

USME offers the Master of Business Administration (MBA) programme, the MBA (Business Analytics), an MBA (Innovation, Entrepreneurship & venture development) and Master of Arts (MA) in Economics programmes at the PG level and the Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) and Bachelor of Arts (Honours) in Economics programmes at the UG level. The Ph.D. programs in Management, Economics and Entrepreneurship/Venture Development disciplines has nineteen scholars at present. There are over one thousand students on the USME Campus at present.






Inauguration of REFOVEO at DTU Main Campus

Training and Placement

The training and placement centre of USME works in collaboration with the Training and Placement Department of DTU. The placement process is, like all premier institutions, a student-run affair, working under the guidance of the faculty coordinators. The team of training and placement cell acts as an interface between the industry and students, and provides counselling, practical assistance and runs programs, to help develop students in various spheres, so that they can achieve their aspirations. The centre also helps students in getting internships and short duration industry projects. Industry experts are invited to groom the students according to the industry specific requirements. The cell organizes career guidance Programmes for all the students from first semester onwards. To enrich the professional competencies of the students there are assessment centres which includes activities like personality profiling, mock interviews, group discussions, business simulations. Along with the placement activities the cell is collecting feedback from industry about performance of students employed and transmitting the same appropriately for corrective actions.



Dr. Amit Mookerjee is Professor, Management, USME. Prior to this he was Professor, Indian Institute of Management Lucknow (IIM-L), for over fifteen years, and served as Dean, IIM Lucknow's Noida Campus; the BPCL Research Chair Professor (2009-10); served on the Board of B-Schools, the IIML Enterprise Incubator Ltd, and others; was Head Analytics and Research/later Director, CMCR at the National Council for Applied Economic Research (NCAER - India's premier think tank). He taught for nearly a decade at MDI, Gurgaon and delivered courses at other IIMs like Kolkata, Raipur, etc, and India specific programs for leading global B Schools. His consulting, research and training services span organisations across diverse sectors in industry (telecom, IT, FMCG, durables, finance and insurance, banking); PSUs and private organizations in core sectors; development sector research/projects for NORAD, GTI (earlier GTZ), Norwegian Government, FICCI; cooperative sector such as NAFED. His interest area is customer experience, building customer profitability and entrepreneurship and venture development. He has contributed papers in respected international journals like MIP, JCM, Media Psychology, a text book on Consumer Behaviour, presented papers in more than 20 international conferences overseas and in India. He completed his BA (Economics, Psychology), MBA, and a PhD in Management, from the ML Sukhadia University, Udaipur.

Prof. K.V. Bhanu Murthy Professor (Adjunct)



Dr. Varsha Sehgal Assistant Professor



ABOUT THE B.A. (H) Economics Programme

The B.A. (H) Economics programme aims to provide a sound understanding of core, pure and applied economics. While students study economics in considerable depth in this specialized degree, students also apply ideas and techniques from many other disciplines too; including analytics, computers, mathematics, statistics, and other ability enhancement courses. Apart from building core knowledge in economics, the course permits students to adopt electives of their interest in management subjects.

Course structure of B.A. (H) Economics

The University is offering a four-year undergraduate program in BA (H) Economics from the 2023-24 academic session. The programme is based on the philosophy and structural elements proposed in the New Education Policy 2020, and the Curriculum and Credit Framework for undergraduate programs published by the UGC in December 2022. The major elements of NEP 2020 such as a structure of certification providing flexibility of learning curriculum, multidisciplinary of learning, interdisciplinary courses, providing for deeper learning in dual disciplines such as through a Minor, have been brought into the curriculum. It is envisaged that with Economics, the streams of Management and Decision Sciences/Analytics that have proven to be of great value, will be strengthened with the provision of a minor in either area.

The programme will offer multiple exit options to the students with an option to obtain a certificate/diploma/3-Year Degree with or without the Minor Specialization/4-Year Honours Degree with or without the Minor Specialization. Drawing upon the strengths of the University and the department, the minor specialization will be offered in the areas of Management and Data Science. In line with the objectives of NEP 2020 and the curriculum framework of undergraduate programmes proposed by UGC, the course structure will include multidisciplinary courses to broaden the intellectual experience of the students; ability enhancement courses to enable the students to acquire and demonstrate the core linguistic skills, including critical reading and expository and academic writing skills, and skill-enhancement courses, including value-added courses which will seek to impart practical skills, hands-on training, soft skills, etc., to enhance the employability of students.

**Each student has to opt for a Generic Elective Course (GEC) of 4 credits in Management or Data Science stream in every semester.

a) If a student takes all GEC courses in Management stream only, securing 24/32 credits over 3 year/4 year, he will get an Economics degree/Economics (honours) degree with a Minor in Management. If a student takes all GEC courses in Data Science stream only, securing 24/32 credits in 3 year/4 year, he will get an Economics degree/Economics (honours) degree with a Minor in Data Science.

b) However, if a student takes a combination of Management and Data Science GEC courses over the six/eight semesters, securing 24/32 credits in 3 year/4 years, he will be awarded an Economics degree/Economics (honours) degree only, with no mention of the Minor stream.

Hence, at the start of Semester 1, the student must specify whether he wants degree/honours degree with minor in management or minor in data science or without any minor stream. Once a choice has been made, students must choose GEC courses accordingly in each semester. Details on the courses, evaluation, and marking scheme in the Management and Data Science streams are shown in Tables 1 and 2, respectively. Note: In Semester I, students also have to register for a Compulsory O2 Credits Course MS199: Community Engagement (Mentoring School Students), duration of which will be one year and the evaluation will be done at the end of Semester II. Further details of this course are mentioned in the Syllabi section for Semester I.

Requirements for Award of Certificate Diploma/Degree in Economics

- 1) UG Certificate in Economics: A student opting for exit after completion of 1st year will be awarded a UG certificate in Economics after fulfilling following conditions:
- a) Secured 40 credits as per BA Economics 1st year curriculum.
- b) One vocational course of 4 credits during the summer vacation of the first year.

These students are allowed to re-enter the degree program within three years and complete the degree program within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.

- 2) UG Diploma in Economics: A student opting for exit after completion of 2nd year will be awarded a UG diploma in Economics after fulfilling following conditions:
- a) Secured 80 credits as per BA Economics 1st and 2nd year curriculum.
- b) One vocational course of 4 credits during the summer vacation of the second year.

These students are allowed to re-enter the degree program within three years and complete the degree program within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.

- 3) 3-Year BA Economics Degree: A student opting for exit after completion of 3 years will be awarded a 3-Year BA Economics Degree after fulfilling following conditions:
- a) Secured 120 credits as per BA Economics 1st, 2nd and 3rd year curriculum.
- b) Out of the above 120 credits, secured 24 credits in GEC courses by studying a combination of Management and Data Science courses over six semesters.

These students are allowed to re-enter the degree with honours program within three years and complete the degree program within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.

4) 3-Year BA Economics Degree with a Minor Degree: A student opting for exit after completion of 3 years will be awarded a 3-Year BA Economics Degree with a Minor in Management/Data Science after fulfilling following conditions:

- a) Secured 120 credits as per BA Economics 1st, 2nd and 3rd year curriculum.
- b) Out of the above 120 credits, secured 24 credits by studying all GEC courses in Management to get Minor in Management Or secured 24 credits by studying all GEC courses in Data Science to get Minor in Data Science.

These students are allowed to re-enter the degree with honours program within three years and complete the degree program within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.

- 5) 4-Year BA Economics (Honours) Degree: A 4-Year BA Economics (Honours) Degree will be awarded after fulfilling following conditions:
- a) Secured 160 credits as per BA Economics 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th year curriculum.
- b) Out of the above 160 credits, secured 32 credits in GEC courses by studying a combination of Management and Data Science courses over eight semesters.
- 6) 4-Year BA Economics (Honours) Degree with a Minor Degree: A 4-Year BA Economics (Honours) Degree with a Minor in Management/Data Science will be awarded after fulfilling following conditions:
- a) Secured 160 credits as per BA Economics 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th year curriculum.
- b) Out of the above 160 credits, secured 32 credits by studying all GEC courses in Management to get Minor in Management Or secured 32 credits by studying all GEC courses in Data Science to get Minor in Data Science.

Admission Eligibility for B.A. (H) Economics:

- 1. The candidate must have appeared in the Common University Entrance Test (CUET) -UG 2024 being conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA).
- 2. The candidate must have scored at least 50% marks in the 12th board examination from a recognised board and must also have passed Mathematics/Applied Mathematics as a subject in the 12th Board Examination. Those who are appearing in the examination may also apply, provided that they submit the proof of eligibility by a specific date declared by the University.
- 3. Candidates belonging to various reserved categories namely OBC (Non-Creamy Layer), Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe, and sub-categories namely Defence, Person with Disability, who apply for seats reserved for them, shall be allowed a relaxation in the minimum marks criterion as mentioned below:
 - Other Backward Class (OBC-NCL): Candidates claiming reservation under Other Backward Class (Non-Creamy Layer) category shall be allowed a relaxation of 5% marks in the minimum marks criterion in the qualifying examination.
 - Scheduled Caste (SC), Scheduled Tribe (ST): Candidates claiming reservation under Scheduled Caste (SC) or Scheduled Tribe (ST) shall be allowed a relaxation of 10% marks in the minimum marks criterion in the qualifying examination.
 - Defence Personnel: Candidates claiming reservation under Defence subcategory (CW) shall be allowed a relaxation of 5% marks in the minimum marks criterion in the qualifying examination.
 - Person with Disability (PwD): Candidates claiming reservation under "Person with Disability" (PD) sub-category shall be allowed a relaxation of 10% marks in the minimum marks criterion in the qualifying examination.

Admission Criteria for B.A. (H) Economics:

Admission to the BA (H) Economics programme for the 2024-25 academic session will be based on the scores obtained in the following combination of subjects in the Common University Entrance Test (CUET) - UG 2024 being administered by the National Testing Agency (NTA):

Mathematics (Section II) + Any two other subjects from Section II + Any one language from Section IA or alternatively any one additional subject from Section II in lieu of a language from Section IA

To resolve and determine inter-se merit of candidates having the same score in the above-mentioned combination of the four subjects, the following criterion will be used in the stated order of preference:

- 1. Candidates having higher score in Mathematics in CUET UG 2024 will be given preference.
- 2. In case the score in Mathematics is the same, then the date of birth will be considered. Elder candidate will be given preference.

Delhi Region

Delhi Region Candidates (85% of seats) - A candidate passing the qualifying examination from a recognized School / College / Institute located within the National Capital Territory (NCT) of Delhi will be considered for Delhi Region only.

Outside Delhi

Outside Delhi Region Candidates (15% of seats) - A candidate passing the qualifying examination from a recognized School / College / Institute located outside the National Capital Territory (NCT) of Delhi will be considered for Outside Delhi Region only.

NOTE: For a candidate, who has passed the qualifying examination through Patrachar Vidyalaya, Delhi / National Institute of Open School, Delhi (NIOS), the criterion for deciding the region shall be the location of his/her centre of examination. In other words, if the centre of examination is located in the N.C.T. of Delhi, the candidate shall be considered under the Delhi Region and if the centre of examination is located outside N.C.T. of Delhi, he/she shall be considered under the Outside Delhi Region.

- i. In case of category (a) and (b), the vacant seats are interchangeable.
- ii. In case, sufficient numbers of eligible candidates from category (c) are not available, the vacancies will be treated as unreserved.
- iii. In case, sufficient number of eligible candidates from the subcategories mentioned at (e) and (f) are not available, the vacancies will be treated as unreserved in the respective category.
- iv. Under CW sub-category, the seats will be filled based on the priority i.e. all eligible candidates of priority-I will be allotted seats based on their ranks until the ranks exhaust or seats exhaust under CW subcategory. Remaining vacant seats, if any, will be allotted to the priority-II in the similar way, and so on. The reservation under CW subcategory is available only to such candidates who fall under the listed priorities.

Application Process for B.A.(H) Economics

- 1. Interested candidates are required to fill the online application form available on www.dtu.ac.in.
- 2. The candidates are required to fill the online application form and make an online payment of Rs. 1,500/- (one thousand five hundred only).
- 3. Incomplete application, due to any reason, is liable for rejection by the University.

Fee Structure for B.A.(H) Economics

The annual fee of the B.A. (H) Economics programme will have to be deposited by the candidate at the time of admission. Candidates must note that the admission fee must be paid in single instalment failing which the admission offer will be withdrawn immediately.

If the admission fee is not paid within the stipulated date, then the offer of admission given to them will be withdrawn automatically and the seat will be offered to the next eligible candidate.

- 1. The candidate must have appeared in the Common University Entrance Test (CUET) PG 2024 conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA).
- 2. The candidate must be a graduate in any discipline with at least 50% marks or equivalent CGPA from a recognised university.
- 3. Candidates belonging to the SC/ST/PWD categories will be eligible for a 5% relaxation in the minimum marks criterion.

Application Process for MA (Economics)

- 1. Interested candidates are required to fill the online application form available on www.dtu.ac.in.
- 2. The candidates are required to fill the online application form and make an online payment of Rs. 1,500/- (one thousand five hundred only).
- 3. Incomplete application, due to any reason, is liable for rejection by the University.

Fee Structure for MA (Economics)

The annual fee of the MA (Economics) programme will have to be deposited by the candidate at the time of admission. Candidates must note that the admission fee must be paid in single instalment failing which the admission offer will be withdrawn immediately.

If the admission fee is not paid within the stipulated date, then the offer of admission given to them will be withdrawn automatically and the seat will be offered to the next eligible candidate.

- 6. Note: The name on the certificate, 12th mark sheet and caste certificate should be exactly same, otherwise an affidavit for the same has to be produced.
- The original documents are to be provided along with the self-attested photocopies of the same in the same order.
- The timing and venue for document verification will be displayed on the DTU website.

CERTIFICATES REQUIRED FOR RESERVED SEATS AT THE TIME OF DOCUMENT VERIFICATION

Candidates applying for any reserved seat (i.e. SC, ST, OBC-NCL, CW, PD, KM, SG, EWS) must produce the original certificates (as applicable) as mentioned below at the time of document verification.

- (i) Scheduled Caste (SC)/Scheduled Tribe (ST) /Other Backward Class (OBCNCL): For admission to a seat reserved for Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe/Other Backward Class (NCL), candidate must produce a certificate, in original, issued from an approved district authority stating the Scheduled Caste/ Scheduled Tribe/ Other Backward Class (NCL), to which the candidate belongs. A list of approved authorities is given below:
- a. District Magistrate / Additional Magistrate / Deputy Commissioner / Collector / Additional Deputy Commissioner / Deputy Collector / 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate / City Magistrate (not below the rank of 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate), Sub-Divisional Magistrate / Taluka Magistrate / Executive Magistrate / Extra Assistant Commissioner.
- b. Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar.
- c. Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the candidates and/or his/her family normally resides
- d. Administrator/Secretary to Administration/Development Officer (Laccadive & Minicoy Islands).

NOTE:

- 1. The candidate seeking admission under reserved categories has to mandatorily produce the caste/category certificate in his/her name at the time of counselling. The certificate in the name of either of the parents (mother/father) or any other family member is not acceptable and the candidate will not be entitled even for provisional admission.
- 2. The reservation certificate should be issued from the respective state/region in which the reservation is being claimed, e.g. in case, a candidate claims the seat reserved for the Delhi Region category, he/she has to bring SC/ST/OBC certificate issued by Govt. of NCT of Delhi and should have also passed his/her qualifying examination from a School / College / Institute located in National Capital Territory of Delhi.

- 3. OBC (NCL) candidates are required to produce a caste certificate issued after March 31, 2024 from the authorities as mentioned above. However, if the certificate is issued prior to March 31, 2024, it must be accompanied with an additional certificate regarding the present non-creamy layer status of the candidate, issued by the same competent authority. This additional certificate must have reference of his / her already issued original caste certificate.
- 4. The EWS Certificate should be issued after March 31, 2024.
- 5. For admission to a seat reserved for Defence subcategory, candidate must produce the following certificates (as applicable), in original, at the time of document verification:
- a. Entitlement card in original issued by the Record Officer of the Unit/Regiment of Armed Personnel of the Armed Forces in case of Armed Personnel or from the Home Ministry in case of Para-Military forces.
- b. Widows/ Wards of the officers and men of Armed forces including Para-Military personnel who died or disabled on duty (both attributable to military service) must produce a certificate to that effect from the following authorities.
- i. Secretary, Kendriya Sainik Board.
 - ii. Secretary, Rajya/Zila Sainik Board.
 - iii. Officer-in-Charge, Record Office.
 - In case of Para-Military forces appropriate documents/certificates issued by Competent Authority notified in this regard by the Para-Military forces headquarters must be produced. A statement to the effect that "the death/physical disability (percentage to be mentioned) is attributed to military service" is required to be included in the certificate.
 - c. Medical records in original.
 - d. Special Pension Order and Passbook indicating special pension.
 - e. Gallantry award certificate.
 - f. Original ex-servicemen Identity Card/Discharge Book/ Pension Payment Order.
 - g. Dependency card issued by the competent authority in order to relate the relationship of the candidate with the Defence personnel/gallantry award recipient.
 - h. Original Service Identity Card
 - i. A certificate from the respective C.O. Unit in respect of serving personnel (Priority VII).

NOTE: A statement to the effect that 'the death/disability is attributed to military service' is required to be included in the certificate for Priority III & IV.

- 6. For admission to seat reserved for Person with Disability (PwD) sub-category, the candidate must produce the following certificates in original at the time of document verification:
- a. A certificate of physical disability issued by a duly notified Medical Board of a District/Government Hospital set up for examining the physicallychallenged candidates under the provision of the Person with Disability (equal opportunities, protection of rights and full participation) Act 1995. The certificate should indicate the extent (i.e. percentage) of the physical handicap and should bear the Photograph of the candidate concerned. The certificate should be countersigned by one of the Doctors constituting the Board issuing the certificates.
- b. A certificate duly recommended by Vocational Rehabilitation Centre for the Handicapped, 9-11 Vikas Marg, Karkardooma, Delhi 110092.
- 7. The candidates seeking admission under Kashmiri Migrants seats must produce the following documents, in original, at the time of document verification:
- a. Certificate of registration as Kashmiri Migrants issued by the Relief Commissioner, Jammu or Divisional Commissioner, Delhi to establish the status of the applicant as registered migrants.
- b. Provisional or original Senior School Certificate examination or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto.
- c.Mark-sheet of the Senior School Certificate Examination or an examinationrecognized as equivalent thereto.
- d. Secondary School Examination or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto (showing the Date of Birth).
- e. Proof of property in Kashmir of the parent of the candidate.
- f. Proof of current residence such as Ration Card, Photo Identity Card issued bythe Election Commissioner, Driving License, etc.
- 8. For claiming admission under the Single Girl Child category, the Father/Mother/Guardian (in case parents are deceased) shall have to submit affidavit / self-attested to this effect duly attested by area District Magistrate /Additional Magistrate / Deputy Commissioner / Collector / Additional Deputy Commissioner / Deputy Collector / 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate / City Magistrate (not below the rank of 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate), Sub-Divisional Magistrate / Taluka Magistrate / Executive Magistrate / Extra Assistant Commissioner
