Summary:

A one-day workshop to ‘Train the Trainer’ on Cyber Security was held on April 17, 2025, in Vigyan Hall, Delhi Technological University organized by the Human Resource Development Centre and Computer Centre, DTU. The event focused on building cyber security awareness and skills among faculty and staff. Through expert talks, discussions, and hands-on activities, participants were empowered to promote digital safety within the university.

Key Highlights:

Welcome Address and Introduction:

- Dr. Anurag Goel, Coordinator, HRDC-DTU, delivered an engaging welcome address, emphasizing the urgent need for cyber security awareness among educators and staff to safeguard the university’s digital environment and foster a culture of safe online practices.
- Prof. Pradeep K. Goyal, Director, HRDC-DTU, presented a sapling to Shri Shashank Gupta, Scientist, Indian Computer Emergency Response Team (CERT-In) as a gesture of welcome and appreciation.



Session by Shri Shashank Gupta, Scientist, CERT-In:

Shri Shashank Gupta, Scientist at CERT-In, delivered the keynote address on the importance of cyber security in the modern digital era. He shared insights from his extensive experience training professionals across India and emphasized the need for educational institutions to adopt strong cyber security practices. Shri Gupta encouraged faculty members to lead by example and promote a culture of digital safety within the university community.

Discussion and Interaction:

- Participants remained engaged throughout the training, helping to create a lively and collaborative environment. The discussions gave faculty and staff a chance to share their own experiences and concerns about digital safety in academic settings. Through group activities and practical examples, attendees explored common challenges in maintaining cyber security and discussed ways to address them.
- The interactive sessions encouraged participants to ask questions and learn from each other's perspectives. Many shared real-life situations, leading to useful exchanges on best practices and lessons learned. The quiz and case study activities deepened understanding, allowing participants to apply their knowledge to problem-solving.
- Overall, the collaborative atmosphere fostered open dialogue and peer learning, making the training both informative and relevant. Participants left the session with a stronger sense of community and a shared commitment to promoting cyber security awareness across the university.

The hands-on session was conducted by two experts from CERT-In. The experts were welcomed with a sapling. The hands-on session was very engaging. The participants enthusiastically participated in the hands-on-session.



Feedback and Outcomes:

Participants responded very positively to the training, especially valuing the interactive and hands-on components. Many noted that the skills and knowledge gained could be immediately applied to their daily work. Key outcomes included:

- Greater awareness of online risks relevant to academic settings
- Practical skills for improving digital safety in day-to-day activities
- New ideas for including cyber safety topics in teaching

- The formation of a supportive network of cyber-aware faculty members across the university.
